Leon County Supervisor of Elections Announces Conclusion of the 2020 Election Cycle

Leon County, FL – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, announces end of election activities for the 2020 Election Cycle. “This Saturday the Leon County Canvassing Board will certify and submit the official results for the 2020 General Election to the Florida Department of State,” said Supervisor Earley. “After the official results are submitted to the State, the Elections Office will conduct a post-election audit, bringing the election cycle to its conclusion. Voters can view the results by visiting LeonVotes.gov and clicking on the ‘Results’ button.”

In its commitment to providing outstanding voter services, the Leon County Supervisor of Elections Office audits each election to the highest standards possible. In Leon County the audit is performed across every contest on 100% of the ballots in every precinct. Every vote in every race on every ballot is checked to ensure the accuracy of the reported results.

To help clean up the community, the Elections Office has partnered with Marpan Recycling to dispose of campaign signs. Starting today, Marpan Recycling will deploy recycling bins at the entrance to their facility at 6020 Woodville Highway. One bin is for the plastic signs, the other bin is for the signs’ wire stands. Candidates, campaigns, and community members are encouraged to gather signs on their property and take them to the bins so they can be recycled. The hours for the Marpan facility are:

- Monday-Friday: 7:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- Saturday: 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
