**Leon County Supervisor of Elections Conducts Additional Vote-by-Mail Outreach**

**Leon County, FL** – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, conducts additional outreach to voters regarding Vote-by-Mail ballots. “I want to make sure that Leon County voters have every opportunity to cast their ballot, so my office is sending Vote-by-Mail ballot request forms to voters who cast their vote using Vote-by-Mail in the 2022 election cycle,” said Supervisor Earley. “By submitting requests now, voters who want to vote by mail during the 2024 elections can ensure they will receive their ballot.”

The Elections Office is mailing a letter to every voter who voted by mail in either the 2022 Primary or General Elections and does not have a Vote-by-Mail ballot request on file. This group includes approximately 33,000 voters. The letter includes a Vote-by-Mail ballot request form and postage-paid return envelope so voters can easily request their ballot. Voters can expect to receive the letter in the next few days. All voters in Leon County can also request a Vote-by-Mail ballot online by visiting [LeonVotes.gov](http://LeonVotes.gov).

Prior to sending out this wave of mail, the Elections Office initially emailed these voters, informing them of the need to submit a new Vote-by-Mail ballot request. This outreach contacted approximately 40,000 voters, and nearly 9,000 responded and submitted a request. This two-step outreach plan allowed the Elections Office to efficiently contact voters while saving thousands of dollars in tax-payer money with reduced postage and mailing costs.

Due to a recent change in Florida law, all Vote-by-Mail ballot requests expire after each general election. Any voter who wants to vote by mail in the 2024 Presidential Preference Primary, Primary, or General Elections needs to take action to request their Vote-by-Mail ballots. “My office has heard from voters that they’re anxious to get their requests back on the books,” said Supervisor Earley. “We want to make the process of requesting your mail ballot as simple and convenient as possible for interested Leon County voters.”
