**Leon County Supervisor of Elections Conducts Vote-by-Mail Outreach**

**Leon County, FL** – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, conducts outreach to voters regarding Vote-by-Mail ballots. “Over the next several weeks, my office will reach out to over 40,000 Leon County voters, giving them the opportunity to request Vote-by-Mail ballots for the 2024 Election Cycle,” said Supervisor Earley. “Although the 2022 General Election concluded only a few months ago, we have already started our preparations for the next set of elections. I want to give Leon County voters every opportunity to vote using the method that works best for them. By submitting requests now, voters who want to vote by mail during the 2024 elections can ensure they will receive their ballot.”

Due to a recent change in Florida law, all Vote-by-Mail ballot requests expire after each general election. Any voter who wants to vote by mail in the 2024 Presidential Preference Primary, Primary, or General Elections needs to take action to request their Vote-by-Mail ballots. “My office has heard from voters that they’re anxious to get their requests back on the books,” said Supervisor Earley. “We plan to make the process of getting your ballot by mail as convenient as possible for interested Leon County voters.”

The outreach will consist of two different waves of communication targeted to voters who have previously voted by mail. This focused outreach ensures that voters who have shown a definite interest in voting by mail have the information they need to continue to do so. First, the Elections Office will email each voter who voted by mail in either the 2022 Primary or General Elections. The second wave of outreach will be a physical letter mailed to each voter who did not respond to the initial email, or who could not be sent the email due to having no email address on file.

All Florida voters have the option to vote by mail in each election, and any Leon County voter who wants to request their Vote-by-Mail ballot is encouraged to do so. The easiest, fastest, and most secure way for voters to request Vote-by-Mail ballot is by using the online tool at [LeonVotes.gov/RequestVBM](https://www.LeonVotes.gov/RequestVBM). Voters can also request Vote-by-Mail ballots by completing a
