Leon County Supervisor of Elections Receives National Recognition for Election Administration

Leon County, FL – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, announces today that his office received recognition from two separate national election organizations. The Leon County Elections Office received a Clearie Award for best practices in recruiting, retaining, and training poll workers from the Elections Assistance Commission (EAC). Additionally, Supervisor Earley was elected to the Executive Committee of the Election Infrastructure Information Sharing & Analysis Center (EI-ISAC).

“The voters of Leon County have come to expect nothing less than the best election administration in the nation,” said Supervisor Earley. “We understand that voter trust must be earned every day. Today’s recognition shows that Leon County Elections continues to lead by example, raising the bar for accuracy, transparency, and security in elections in our community and across America.”

Clearinghouse Award

The [Clearinghouse Awards](#), also known as the “Clearie” Awards, are presented annually across the U.S. for best practices in election administration by the U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC).

Established by the Help America Vote Act of 2002, the EAC is charged with serving as a clearinghouse for election administration information. The EAC launched the Clearies in 2016 to promote best practices in elections. Winners are selected by independent panels of election officials and members from the EAC’s advisory boards.

“The Clearie Awards give the EAC an opportunity to recognize the hard work and dedication of election officials across the country,” said EAC Chairman Thomas Hicks. “The recipients of these awards should be incredibly proud of the work they did to ensure the accuracy, security and accessibility of elections. 
