**Leon County Supervisor of Elections Reminds Voters of October 5 Voter Registration
Deadline for General Election**

Leon County, FL – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, reminds voters that Monday, October 5th is the last day to register to vote in time for the November 3rd General Election.

“I encourage all eligible Leon County citizens who wish to participate in the General Election to register to vote,” said Supervisor Earley. “Voters have several options to register in Leon County, and my office will hold extended hours of operation on October 5th to ensure that all eligible citizens have the opportunity to register.”

Voters may register to vote in time for the General Election using any of these methods:

- Online at www.LeonVotes.gov/ovr (complete by 11:59 pm on October 5th).
- Mail a voter registration form to PO Box 7357, Tallahassee, FL 32314-7357 (must be postmarked by October 5th).
- Visit the Leon County Supervisor of Elections Office at 2990-1 Apalachee Parkway (corner of Apalachee Pkwy and Capital Circle SE). Office hours are extended to 8:00 pm on October 5th.

Voters who are registered in another Florida county and have recently moved to Leon County are encouraged to update their voting address to Leon County before going to vote. A voter can update their address using any of the methods used to register to vote. In addition, voters can call the Elections Office at (850) 606-8683 and the address update can be processed over the phone. The October 5th deadline to register to applies only to new registrations. Voters who are already registered to vote in Florida can make changes to their existing registration after October 5th.
