**Leon County Supervisor of Elections Reminds Voters of Options for 2022 General Election**

**Leon County, FL** – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County reminds voters of options to vote in the 2022 General Election. “I encourage every registered voter to make their voice heard by voting in this election,” said Supervisor Earley. “You have three ways to cast your ballot in the November 8 General Election. You can vote by mail, vote at any Early Voting site in the County, or cast your ballot at your Election Day polling place next Tuesday.”

**Early Voting**

Early Voting runs through Sunday, November 6. Voters can cast a ballot at any of the 10 sites located throughout Leon County.

**Voting by Mail**

The deadline for voters to be mailed a ballot has passed. However, voters can still pick up a Vote-by-Mail ballot in person from the Elections Office at 2990-1 Apalachee Parkway. This option is available through Election Day. Vote-by-Mail ballots can also be picked up from any Early Voting site during voting hours. Voters can also have a family member or someone else they designate pick up a Vote-by-Mail ballot for them.

In order to count, the Elections Office must receive Vote-by-Mail ballots by 7 p.m. on Election Day<sup>1</sup>. The United States Postal Service recommends voters mail their ballots at least one week before Election Day, so voters who have yet to return them are encouraged to return their Vote-by-Mail ballots in person instead of using the mail. Voters can hand-deliver Vote-by-Mail ballots to a secure ballot intake station (also known as a drop box) located at each Early Voting site during voting hours. Voters can also have a family member or someone else drop off the ballot for them. Vote-by-Mail ballots can also be returned directly to the Elections Office located at 2990-1 Apalachee Parkway:

- Regular business hours are 8:30 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- The Office is open on Saturday November 5<sup>th</sup> and Sunday, November 6<sup>th</sup> from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Hours are extended to 8:30 a.m. – 7 p.m. on Monday, November 7<sup>th</sup>.
- Hours are extended to 7 a.m. – 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 8<sup>th</sup>. Ballots must be received by 7 p.m. this day in order to count.

Vote-by-Mail ballots must be returned in the green envelope, with the voter's signature and date signed.

### **Voting at the Polls on Election Day**

On Election Day, voters need to cast a ballot at their assigned polling place. Due to redistricting, some voters have new polling places this year, so voters are strongly encouraged to check their polling place assignment before heading out to vote. Voters can find their assigned polling place on their voter information card, online at [LeonVotes.gov](https://www.LeonVotes.gov) by clicking the "Your Voter Info" button, or by calling the office at (850) 606-8683. On Election Day, each polling place is open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Any voters waiting in line at 7 p.m. will have the opportunity to cast a ballot.
