Leon County Supervisor of Elections Reminds Voters of Options for 2022 Primary Election

Leon County, FL – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County reminds voters of options to vote in the 2022 Primary Election. “Voters have three ways to cast their ballots in the upcoming Primary Election,” said Supervisor Earley. “Voters can return their Vote-by-Mail ballot, vote at any Early Voting sites in the county, or cast their ballots at their Election Day polling place. Although this is a Primary Election, all voters in Leon County, regardless of party affiliation, have the option to cast a ballot. I encourage every registered voter to make their voice heard.”

Early Voting

Early Voting runs through Sunday, August 21. Voters can cast a ballot at any of the 10 sites located throughout Leon County.

Voting by Mail

The last day for voters to request to be mailed a Vote-by-Mail ballot was August 13, 10 days before Election Day. However, voters can still pick up a Vote-by-Mail ballot in person from the Elections Office at 2990-1 Apalachee Parkway up to and including Election Day. Voters can also have a family member or someone else they designate pick up a Vote-by-Mail ballot for them.

Vote-by-Mail ballots must be received by the Election Office by 7 p.m. on Election Day in order to count. The United States Postal Service recommends that voters mail their ballots at least one week before Election

Day. Alternatively, voters can hand-deliver their Vote-by-Mail ballots to secure ballot intake stations (also known as drop boxes) located at each Early Voting site during voting hours. Voters can also have a family member or someone else drop off the ballot for them. They can also be returned to the Elections Office during regular business hours, with extended hours on Election Day. Vote-by-Mail ballots must be returned in the green envelope, with the voter's signature and date signed.

Voting at the Polls on Election Day

On Election Day, voters need to cast a ballot at their assigned polling place. Due to redistricting, some voters have new polling places this year, so voters are strongly encouraged to check their polling place assignment before heading out to vote. Voters can find their assigned polling place on their voter information card, online at LeonVotes.gov by clicking the "Your Voter Info" button, or by calling the Supervisor of Elections Office at (850) 606-8683. On Election Day, each polling place will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Any voters waiting in line at 7 p.m. will have the opportunity to cast a ballot.
