**Leon County Supervisor of Elections Reminds Voters of Voter Registration and Party Change
Deadline for 2022 Primary Election**

Leon County, FL – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, reminds voters that Monday, July 25th is the last day to register to vote or to change political party affiliation in time for the August 23rd Primary Election.

“I encourage all eligible Leon County residents who wish to participate in the Primary Election to register to vote or update their voter registration record now,” said Supervisor Earley. “Voters have several options to register in Leon County, and my office will stay open late on July 25th to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to register or change their political party affiliation.”

Voters may register or change their political party using any of these methods:

- Online at [RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov](https://www.RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov) (complete by 11:59 p.m. on July 25th).
- Mail a voter registration form to PO Box 7357, Tallahassee, FL 32314-7357 (must be postmarked by July 25th).
- Visit the Leon County Supervisor of Elections Office at 2990-1 Apalachee Parkway (corner of Apalachee Pkwy and Capital Circle SE). Office hours are extended to 7 p.m. on July 25th.

In the Primary Election, all voters can cast a ballot. Voters registered with one of Florida’s political parties express their preference for the candidates they would like to represent their party in the November General Election. In addition, all voters, regardless of party affiliation, can vote in nonpartisan races on the ballot. County Commission, City Commission, School Board, and County Judge races are nonpartisan and will appear on most voters’ ballots in the August primary election. Many of these races could be decided then, so voters who do not vote in the Primary will miss their chance to vote in these very important local contests.

Voters can view their current voter registration information, including party affiliation, by going to [LeonVotes.gov](https://www.LeonVotes.gov) and clicking on the “Your Voter Info” button.
