### **Leon County Supervisor of Elections Supports 2022 National Poll Worker Recruitment Day**

**Leon County, FL** – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, supports 2022 National Poll Worker Recruitment Day. “January 25<sup>th</sup> is National Poll Worker Recruitment Day, and I encourage all voters to consider serving your community as election workers,” said Supervisor Earley. “Serving as an election worker is one of the best ways you can engage with your community and be a part of our nation’s history of free and fair elections. Election workers are an essential part of our elections. While we have a dedicated core of election workers here in Leon County, every year we need to refill our ranks to ensure that all of our Early Voting sites and Election Day polling places will be fully staffed and ready to serve the voters of Leon County.”

Established in 2020 by the U.S. Election Assistance Commission, National Poll Worker Recruitment Day is a day of action with the goal of encouraging potential poll workers to sign up to help America vote. As part of the preparations for the Primary and General Elections, over 1,000 Leon County residents will be trained as election workers. The Elections Office holds training classes online and in-person so workers gain experience with the voting equipment and are prepared to serve voters.

The Elections Office needs workers to staff Early Voting sites for multiple days as well as a single day of service on Election Day. In order to serve as an election worker in Leon County, a person must be a registered voter in Leon County. Election workers are compensated for their service. Voters who are interested in becoming election workers can get started by completing an online application at [LeonVotes.gov](https://LeonVotes.gov).
