Leon County Supervisor of Elections Supports Outreach Efforts to Potential Voters by the Florida Department of State

Leon County, FL – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, supports outreach efforts to potential voters by the Florida Department of State.

“Over the next several days, over 20,000 potential voters in Leon County will receive a postcard with information on how to register and vote in Florida” said Supervisor Earley. “This outreach will help to ensure that all eligible Floridians will have the opportunity to cast a ballot in the November 3rd General Election.”

The Florida Department of State is sending the postcards as part of Florida’s initial membership in the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC). Membership in ERIC will allow Supervisors of Elections throughout Florida to compare voter information with 29 other member states to help efficiently maintain accurate and up-to-date voter rolls. More than 2,000,000 Floridians who are potentially eligible but unregistered to vote will receive the postcard in the mail. It directs them to RegistertoVoteFlorida.gov where Floridians can register to vote online.

“I encourage all eligible Leon County citizens to register to vote,” said Supervisor Earley. “September 22 is National Voter Registration Day, so now is the perfect time to register to vote or confirm your existing registration.”

October 5th is the last day to register to vote in time for the November 3rd General Election. Leon County citizens can register to vote using any of these methods:

- Online at www.LeonVotes.gov/ovr
- Mail a voter registration form to PO Box 7357, Tallahassee, FL 32314-7357
- Visit the Leon County Supervisor of Elections Office at 2990-1 Apalachee Parkway (corner of Apalachee Pkwy and Capital Circle SE)

Voters can view their current voter registration information by going to www.LeonVotes.gov and clicking on the “Your Voter Info” button.
