

Advisory Opinion Request Form

Overview: In Florida, you lose the right to vote when you are convicted of a felony. Once you complete all terms of your sentence, including parole, probation, and payment of fines, fees, and restitution, your right to vote is automatically restored. If you do not know if you have any outstanding fines, fees, or restitution that prevent you from registering to vote, you can ask for information about how much you owe.
