

COLLEGE STUDENT VOTING

If you are attending a college or university in Tallahassee, you can register to vote here or back in your home county.



Register in Leon County

You can register to vote in Leon County, even if you still use your home address for other documents.

In addition to federal and state contests, your ballot will include local contests for Leon County.

How do I register or update my registration address?

Visit RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov to register to vote or to update your registration. If you live on campus, use your residence hall street address, residence hall name, or campus mail center address as your residence.

Use your campus mailbox or another address as your mailing address. Visit LeonVotes.gov for additional ways to register to vote.



Register in Your Home County

If you moved to Leon County for school but still have a residence in your home county, you can register in your home county or keep your registration there.

In addition to federal and state races, your ballot will include local races for your home county.

How do I register or update my registration address?

Visit RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov to register to vote or to update your registration.

Use your home county address as your residential address and your Leon County address as your mailing address. If your home county is outside of Florida, contact your state's elections office for information on how to register to vote.

How do I vote?

If you are registered to vote in Leon County, you can vote in person here or request a mail ballot from us. You have three ways to vote.

Visit LeonVotes.gov to learn more about Voting-by-Mail, Early Voting, and Voting at the polls on Election Day.

How do I vote?

Contact your home county's elections office and request a Vote-By-Mail ballot be mailed to your mailing address in Leon County. After you complete your ballot, you must return it to your home county's elections office.

Or, you can travel to your home county to Early Vote or vote on Election Day.

COLLEGE STUDENT VOTING

Voting is important! Make sure you know the facts before you vote.

How do I know if I'm registered to vote in Florida?

Visit RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov and click "Am I Already Registered?" If you are not registered or if the information is outdated, you can use that website to register to vote or update your voter information.



Is there a deadline to register to vote?

You can register to vote at any time. However, to vote in an election you must be registered 29 days before that election.

You can update an existing registration at any time. However, party affiliation changes must be made at least 29 days before an election.



I'm registered, what happens now?

We will mail you a voter information card. If you do not receive the card within two weeks, contact us to make sure we have your correct information. Your voter information card cannot be used as a form of ID when you vote.



When & where do I vote?

If you are registered in Leon County, use our voter information lookup to find election dates, polling locations, Vote-by-Mail ballot status, sample ballots, and other important voting information. If you have any questions, contact our office at Vote@LeonVotes.gov or by phone at (850)606-8683.
