Leon County Supervisor of Elections Mails Election Guides for 2024 Presidential Preference Primary Election

Leon County, FL – Mark S. Earley, Supervisor of Elections for Leon County, announces the mailing of the official Leon County Election Guide for the 2024 Presidential Preference Primary Election (PPP). “This week my office will mail the Official Election Guide to Leon County voters registered with the Republican Party of Florida,” said Supervisor Earley. “The Guide contains a sample ballot for the election, and is full of other valuable information about where, when, and how voters can cast their ballots in the March 19 PPP. I encourage voters to thoroughly read their Election Guide, so they are election ready for the PPP.”

Leon County voters registered with the Republican Party of Florida can expect to receive their Election Guide in the mail within the next week. Voters can also view or download a copy of the guide from LeonVotes.gov at any time. The guide contains information about the three ways to vote in Florida elections: Vote-by-Mail, Early Voting, and Election Day voting at your polling place. In addition, the guide contains a sample ballot for the PPP as required by law. The sample ballot includes all the candidates designated by the Republican Party of Florida. Some of those candidates may have withdrawn or suspended their campaigns, but legally their names remain on the ballot and votes for them will be counted.

The PPP is part of how political parties select presidential candidates. Since the Florida Democratic Party nominated Joe Biden as their sole candidate and there are no other contests on the ballot in Leon County, only voters registered with the Republican Party of Florida will have a ballot in the Leon County PPP. Leon County voters registered with the Democratic Party, a minor party, or no party will not receive a ballot or election guide in this election. The deadline to change party affiliation in time for this election was February 20.
